

Native Plants for Native Wildlife

The garden before you was planted in 2017 and includes wildflowers native to New Jersey. The plants included in the garden have been carefully selected for their benefits to wildlife species.

For example, blazing star (right) has been planted as it benefits pollinators such as the monarch butterfly. Pollinators, like bees and butterflies need your help—plant a native pollinator garden in your yard. Keep in mind that the use of herbicides and pesticides can be detrimental to beneficial insects.



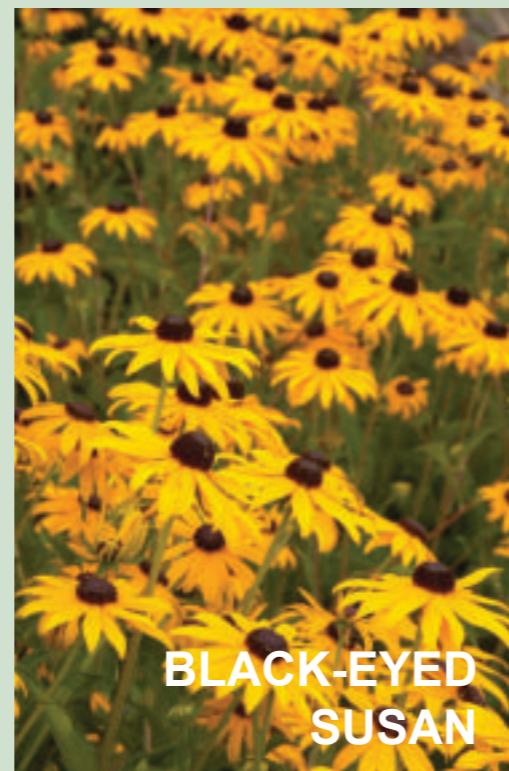
